• Companionship Circle with Dr Ahmed Arafat, Resident Scholar

A part of the Suhbah Program: a monthly program for Brothers and Sisters of Mecca's convert community dedicated to fostering spiritual growth and expanding Islamic knowledge. Sheikh Ahmed Arafat follows the prophetic style of teaching through companionship. The session consists of a lecture on a given topic followed by a discussion and Q&A. The program is for both men and women and is exclusive to The Mecca Center's convert community. The program takes place every first Wednesday of the month, after Maghreb prayer in the Youth Lounge (Old Wing).

Quran Seekers

 In collaboration with the Mecca Quran Institute: an Arabic and Quran Program is specifically designed for converts learning to read the Quran in Arabic. All students attend free of charge. There are three levels available: beginner, intermediate, and advanced. These in-person classes take place every Saturday at 10 am at The Mecca Center. Certificate of Shahadah

 A legal certificate declaring the convert's religion of Islam; signed by the resident Sheikh (the documentation is helpful to converts during travel, especially for Hajj and Umrah, and other life matters).

 The Mecca Center Muslim Convert Committee Social Program organizes social events, gatherings, and opportunities for converts. We aim to create an environment where we can build meaningful relationships, feel a sense of community, and feel supported.

Grocery Shopping for New Muslims

Learning to differentiate between halal and haram food products in the grocery aisles can feel daunting sometimes. Many foods are easily determined to be halal or haram. This list is meant to help you discern some of the trickier items. By no estimate is this list meant to be exhaustive.

- Pork and pork derivatives are forbidden (haram).
 - o Lard
 - $\circ \ Sausage$
 - o Bacon
 - o Ham

- Alcohol
 - Wine

 The list for alcohol ingredients could go on and on. These are some of the more common ones to look for in the ingredients listed on the labels. Check sauces, ice cream, chocolates, and prepared soups. These are common items that are often found to contain alcohol of some type.

• Other:


- Mirin (asian cooking wine) & white wine used for cooking (substitute white wine in cooking for rice vinegar or other vinegars to produce similar effect*)
- Gummies like some fruit snacks (check ingredient list for gelatin)
- o Tiramisu (some places use rum as an ingredient)
- Pasta with vodka sauce
- Medicines with gelatin capsules (unless it specifies that is it vegetable, fish, or bovine gelatin, it is most like porcine gelatin)
- Pop Tarts with frosting (contains gelatin)
- Marshmallows & treats with marshmallows like rice crispies

*In regard to Gelatin-There are many sources of gelatin. The sources include pork, beef, fish, and vegetables. In the US, if the label is not clear as to the source, we must assume that it is pork unless there is a halal or kosher certification on the label. Kosher designates that the food is permissible for Jews to eat. Pork is forbidden for Jews also. When relying on kosher designation, double check that the food product has no alcohol. Examples of kosher and halal certifications are as follows:

*Vinegar - vinegar is halal even though it contains a percentage of alcohol. This is because the production of alcohol in vinegar occurs *naturally* (meaning nothing was added to it to purposefully produce alcohol). Furthermore, no matter how much vinegar you drink, it will never intoxicate. This is true for certain fruits as well which will always have a small portion of

alcohol in them - but because this percentage is so low and occurs naturally, it is halal to consume. We also know from various sources that our Prophet (saws) consumed vinegar!

Keep in mind this is a learning process! Be diligent with checking ingredient labels & most waiters / waitresses at restaurants will happily check for you if you suspect something on their menu might contain pork, gelatin, or alcohol.



These are examples of kosher indicators that can be found on various food labels and are especially helpful when buying fruit flavored yogurts.



The symbols above are representative of halal designations.

Besides yogurt, there are several food items to be cautious when considering. Anything with marshmallows! Don't despair, there are some delicious halal marshmallows available and halal rice krispie treats can be found in most halal meat shops. Lucky Charms cereal, Frosted Pop Tarts, hot chocolate with marshmallows in the mix, puddings and pie fillings are some common items that use gelatin. Fans of gummy candies, beware! Gummy candies usually contain gelatin but the local halal meat shops often carry halal brands of gummy candy. Haribo is a common brand of gummy candy and they warrant extra attention. Whether Haribo is halal depends on where it is made. The Haribo candy made in Turkey is good to go.The Haribo from Germany is not allowable. Check the labels.

This is not an exhaustive lesson in halal/ haram. It's intended just to help with basic grocery shopping food choices.
